Wildlife adventure is not only a great choice for a holiday with kids, it is also one of the best ways to connect with nature. Imagine waking up to the bird calls and not the alarm clock on your desk; not wanting to snooze any longer and heading out in the greens. Singing with the winds and walking by the riverside to spot animals drinking water. The feeling is extraordinary and absolutely high on the wish list for nature lovers.

Thanks to our varied geographical terrains, India is home to scores of species of mammals, rare birds, reptiles, insects and amphibians. Add to it, the diverse flora that supports our ecosystem. However, many species of birds and animals are now on the verge of becoming extinct because of climate and geographic changes and also by excessive hunting by man (for food, medicine and recreational reasons). According to ecologists, more than 600 species of animals and birds are expected to be extinct if not protected by wildlife management.

The final call is ours and the first step is to **reconnect** with nature and safeguard the wildlife habitat. Start now...

HEAD TO: BANDHAVGARH, KANHA, JIM CORBETT, RANTHAMBORE

Spotting the national animal of India — the Tiger, can be a fabulous experience. You can take your family on a tiger trail to **Bandhavgarh**, which is over 200 kms north-east of Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh. The nearest village is Tala, which is the access point of the park.

In MP itself, Kanha National Park has the pride of providing the setting for Rudyard Kipling's classic novel, *The Jungle Book*. This large park is well regarded for its research and conservation programme.

If you prefer a drive from Delhi, then head to Ranthambore National Park. Take your kids to India's first national park — Corbett, which was established in 1936 by legendary tiger hunter **Jim Corbett**. Located in **Uttarakhand**, around three hours from Nainital and seven hours from Delhi.

STAY OPTIONS: King's Lodge, Tiger's Den Resort, Mahua Kothi Resort and Treehouse Hideaway and Syna Tiger Resort at Bandhavgarh.

At Kanha, stay over at Baghira Log Huts, Wild Chalet Resort, Pugmark Resort, Kanha Jungle Lodge and Mumba Resort.

At Corbett, stay over at Tiger Camp, Corbett River View Retreat, Ramganga Resort, Ashoka's Tiger Trail and Camp Forktail Creek Jungle Lodge.



MISSION: SPOT ASIATIC LIONS

HEAD TO: GIR NATIONAL PARK

The Gir Forest National Park and Wildlife Sanctuary (also known as Sasan-Gir), is a forest and wildlife sanctuary in Gujarat. Established in 1965, the park is located 65 kms to the south-east of Junagadh and 60 kms to south-west of Amreli. It is the sole home of the pure Asiatic Lions (Panthera leo persica) and is considered to be one of the most important protected areas in Asia due to its supported species. The ecosystem of Gir, with its diverse flora and fauna, is protected as a result of the efforts of the government forest department, wildlife activists and NGOs. The forest area of Gir and its lions were declared as 'protected' in the early 1900s by the then Nawab of the princely state of Junagadh.

STAY OPTIONS: Sinh Sadan Guest House, Fern Gir Resort, and Maneland Jungle Lodge, around three kms from the park entrance are the popular ones here. Gir Birding Lodge offers good

MISSION: PROTECT THE **ASIAN ELEPHANTS** Project Elephant was launched in 1992 by the

Government of India Ministry of Environment and Forests to protect wild Asian Elephants. The project aims to ensure long term survival of elephants in their natural habitats. Other goals of Project Elephant are supporting research of the ecology and management of elephants and creating conservation awareness among local people. You can participate in this project in Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Orissa, Tamil Nadu, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh

and West Bengal.

MISSION: EXOTIC BIRD WATCHING • HEAD TO: BHARATPUR NATIONAL PARK, CHILKA LAKE BIRD **SANCTUARY AND PERIYAR WILDLIFE SANCTUARY**

Diverse geographical landscapes in our country has made it a true paradise for bird watchers, with around **1,200 species of birds**. The main reason behind this attraction is the diversity of climate, vegetation and the altitude. Bird watching is one of the best mediums to enjoy for nature lovers. India is also a home to more than 450 wildlife sanctuaries and 90 national parks. Bird watching in India has attracted a number of ornithologists and nature lovers from all over since ages. When you head out for a bird watching session, avoid any unwanted disturbance in the national parks and

You can also head out to Valley of Flowers at Chamoli District, Uttaranchal; Kaundinya Bird Sanctuary at Chittor, Andhra Pradesh and Kawal **Sanctuary** at Mancherial in Andhra Pradesh.

STAY OPTIONS: Government run guests houses are popular choices for stay at these reserves. Some of them do not offer overnight stay. It's a good idea to check beforehand and then make the booking.
